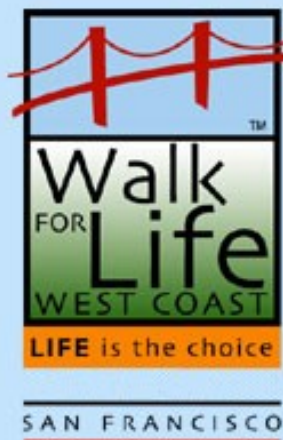

THOUGHTS ON TODAY'S READINGS

God chose David, the youngest of Jesse's sons, to be anointed king of Israel, and gave the shepherd boy the courage to single-handedly face the giant Goliath and conquer him.

Today, we hear the prophet Nathan telling David that God's promise is that his throne should stand firm forever. But there would be other kings after David, and there would be a period of exile for the Israelites in Babylon before their return to the land of Israel. And finally—in *the fullness of time*—God would send the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary in Nazareth. And Jesus, her Son, who is called “Son of David” many times in the Gospels, would fulfill all the ancient promises!

But sadly, many people had stopped watching and waiting, they stopped being faithful to God—who always keeps His promises.

Though there were many centuries between the life of David and the coming of Jesus, God was watching over His people the entire time, but many people lost their faith in God, were distracted by the things of this world, and turned to idols for excitement and thrills, forgetting their identity. They forgot that they were God's *chosen people*, and they would suffer for their infidelity.

But Mary knew who she was: “I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” She's the model for the Church, remaining faithful even in her many sorrows, and now she is the Queen of Heaven!

Perhaps it seems to us that God is far away and doesn't hear us, but we must remember our identity.

The Holy Water at the church door reminds us of our Baptism where we became temples of the Holy Spirit, just as Mary was a living temple, carrying Jesus wherever she went. We, too, were anointed with Sacred Chrism to live always as a member of Christ's body, sharing everlasting life.

Jesus is the fulfillment of the promises made to David.

And our Baptism makes us members of the body of Christ, so we share the life of Jesus and the promise of everlasting life in heaven. That's who we are.

Jesus wants us to share His life in heaven with His Father.

Though we might be tempted to forget God, distracted by all the things of this world, the manger scene brings it all down to earth for us: God came down to earth in the fullness of time, and was born in that little town of Bethlehem.

And God dwells in you and in me right now! That's who we are, and our eternal happiness depends on our remembering who we are, and in following the example of our mother, Mary. “I am the servant of the Lord. Let whatever God wants of me ... be done to me.”
