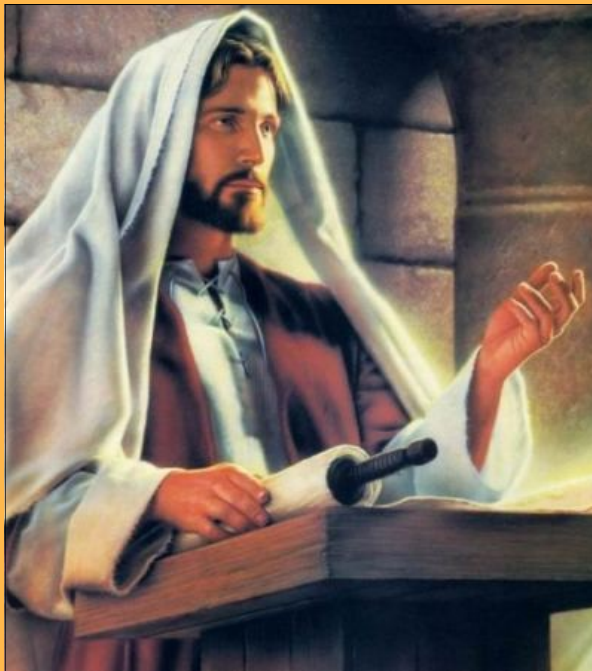

If each of us joins in this united effort, we can easily do our part in supporting our Parish and the entire Archdiocese of San Francisco.

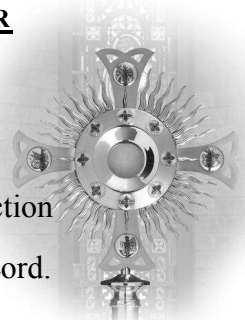

LET US PRAY TO CHANGE THE CULTURE

Archbishop Cordileone, in unity with the other bishops of the United States, is asking local Catholics to pray and sacrifice in 4 ways to protect freedom, marriage, and life.

1. Eucharistic Adoration
2. Prayers at Mass
3. Praying the Rosary
4. Fasting & Abstinence

Jesus was once asked by his disciples why it was that he was able to cast out a spirit while they had been unable to do so. He responded by saying, “This kind can only come out through prayer,” and some biblical manuscripts also have “and through fasting.”

So, we have it on the word of Jesus, himself, that prayer and fasting can obtain great results.

DAYS OF PRAYER

The United States Conference of Conference of Catholic Bishops has announced “Nine Days of Prayer, Penance and Pilgrimage” around January 22, the 40th anniversary *Roe v. Wade*-- the Supreme Court decision that struck down laws protecting unborn human life.

“The bishops recognize that prayer is the foundation of all our efforts on behalf of human life,” said Tom Grenchik, executive director of the USCCB’s Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities. “These nine days of focused prayer and sacrifice are a great opportunity for people across the nation to unite their voices in prayer to God.”

The nine days will take place from January 19 to 27; events include the National Prayer Vigil for Life (January 24-25) and the March for Life (January 25). Interested Catholics can sign up to receive novena prayers by e-mail or text message. Other suggested activities include special Masses and holy hours.

The “Nine Days of Prayer, Penance and Pilgrimage” are part of the US bishops “Call to Prayer for Life, Marriage, and Religious Liberty,” in which the bishops have requested a monthly holy hour, daily Rosary, and fast and abstinence on all Fridays until the Feast of Christ the King in November.
