Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During his visit to detainees at Curran-Fromhold correctional facility Pope Francis said,

Jesus comes to meet us, so that he can restore our dignity as children of God. He wants to help us to set out again, to resume our journey, to recover our hope, to restore our faith and trust. He wants us to keep walking along the paths of life, to realize that we have a mission, and that confinement is never the same thing as exclusion...It is painful when we see prison systems which are not concerned to care for wounds, to soothe pain, to offer new possibilities.

With these words, Pope Francis continues to bring our attention back to the poor and our responsibility toward them. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) responds directly to this call by addressing the root causes of poverty in the United States.

Last year thanks to your donations, the California Catholic Conference was awarded support to establish and promote a Restorative Justice Network throughout the state of California. The grant will enable a supportive network and training for local leaders and community organizers in restorative justice principles, research on the impacts of the criminal justice system in California, and the creation of replicable faith-based, community-based models for the integration of ex-prisoners.

Our own Archdiocese is part of the nine California dioceses receiving funding for the Restorative Justice ministry, which allows us to expand its work with victims and crime survivors, incarcerated people, and formerly-incarcerated people. The Restorative Justice Ministry also provides training, conferences, and retreats for healing and uses community organizing models to advocate for policies that help reduce violence in our local communities.

This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs, like the grant that supports the California Catholic Conference and part of our restorative justice ministry. Funding from the collection offers new hope every year to those living in poverty throughout the United States. And remember, 25 percent of the collection's proceeds stay here in our archdiocese to fight poverty in our community and defend the dignity of our neighbors. Help us defend human dignity and show Christ's charity to those in need.
